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

New Budget Payment Plan Options Available for Members

Rolling Hills Electric Cooperative, Inc. now offers two options for the Residential Budget Payment Plan.

The first option is the **FIXED BUDGET** that Rolling Hills Electric has offered for many years.

The newest option is a **VARIABLE BUDGET.** This amount is calculated on a



12-month average, iust as the Fixed Budget is, but the Variable Budget recalculates each month with the most recent 12-month average. This does give a chance of a small fluctuation

in your monthly budget depending on the weather and your usage from month to month. However, there is no catch-up month with the Variable Budget plan.

If you are interested in either Residential Budget Payment Plan option, please call the office during normal business hours of Monday-Friday, 8 a.m.-5 p.m. and we would be glad to discuss options with you.
